2025 District Director Elections

During the 2025 June District Meetings (JDMs), the AMM will be conducting elections for the AMM Board of Directors in all seven (7) Districts. Each District is entitled to two (2) Directors per District.

Eligibility: Only elected municipal officials may nominate a candidate. Any elected official (Head of Council, Mayor, Reeve, Councillor) is eligible for nomination.

Nomination Process:

- Download the <u>Nomination Form</u>, which includes candidate's acceptance.
- Submit the completed form to AMM Executive Director Denys Volkov at dvolkov@amm.mb.ca by June 1, 2025 at 4:30 PM.
- The elected individuals will serve on the AMM Board of Directors until June 2027.

A Major Step Forward for Interprovincial Trade: Manitoba-Ontario Agreement a Win for Business and the Chamber Network



The Manitoba Chambers of Commerce (MCC) welcomes <u>announcement</u> by Premier Wab Kinew and Ontario Premier Doug Ford of a new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the provinces of Manitoba and Ontario. This agreement aims to

strengthen the flow of goods, services, investment, and labour mobility between our provinces – an important milestone in the movement toward true internal free trade within Canada.

From the perspective of Manitoba's business community, this is more than a symbolic gesture – it is a tangible commitment to economic collaboration and modernization that will benefit companies, workers, and consumers in both provinces.

Many interprovincial trade barriers – the rules and restrictions around how businesses buy, sell, or move goods and services between provinces – come from provincial regulations like licensing, certification rules, or differing standards. Without coordination between provinces, these rules persist or even multiply, making it difficult for businesses to operate freely across borders. Given the climate of geopolitical uncertainty, dismantling interprovincial trade barriers is no longer an option, it's a necessity.

National Slow Down Move Over Day



Every year CAA clubs across Canada mark the second Tuesday of May as National Slow Down Move Over Day. The day acts as a reminder for drivers to slow down and move over for emergency vehicles and stopped tow trucks with flashing amber lights on the side of the road. This year, National Slow Down Move Over Day fell on May 13.

CAA has been the leading advocate in Canada to ensure that 'Slow Down, Move Over' laws include tow trucks, along with police, ambulance and fire and this year CAA partnered with the Government of Manitoba and RCMP to emphasize the importance of slowing down and moving over.

"It's important to always remember that for many, the side of the road is someone's workplace, and everyone deserves a safe place to work," said Ewald Friesen, Manager of Government Relations for CAA Manitoba. "'Slow Down, Move Over' laws protect our tow operators, our contractor network and the stranded drivers we serve every day."

If the posted speed limit is less than 80 km/h, you must slow down to 40 km/h. If it's 80 km/h or higher, reduce your speed to 60 km/h. This applies equally to emergency vehicles and tow trucks.

As we approach the summer driving season, it is important for drivers to slow down and move over when approaching a roadside emergency rescue. By doing so, we can help protect the lives of those who work on our roads and highways and make our roads safer for everyone.
