

AMM POLICY FOR 'EMERGENT' & LATE RESOLUTIONS

- 1. All resolutions should be brought forward through the June District meetings; however, 'emergent' resolutions may be accepted and considered for debate at the Annual Convention in November.
- 2. Following the June District meetings, a resolution may be sponsored and forwarded to the Resolutions Committee meeting in September.
 - o If the resolution is deemed to be emergent in nature by the Resolutions Committee, it will be forwarded for debate at the Annual Convention. An emergent resolution is one that deals with an issue that is urgent and pressing in nature and could not have been dealt with prior to June.
 - o If the resolution is <u>not</u> deemed to be emergent in nature and therefore late, it will be forwarded to the following year's June District meeting for consideration.
- 3. Following the September Resolutions Committee meeting, a resolution may be sponsored and forwarded to the Resolutions Committee meeting at the Annual Convention.
 - o If the resolution is deemed to be emergent in nature, it will be forwarded for debate at the Annual Convention. An emergent resolution is one that deals with an issue that is urgent and pressing in nature and could not have been dealt with prior to September.
 - o If the resolution is <u>not</u> deemed to be emergent in nature and therefore late, it will be forwarded to the following year's June District meeting for consideration.
- 4. Resolutions will be considered up until the time of the Resolutions Committee's meeting at the Annual Convention. Late resolutions submitted after the Resolutions Committee's meeting at the Annual Convention will not be accepted by the AMM.
- 5. All resolutions must first be passed at a meeting of Council. If a resolution is not first passed by a local Council, it will not be accepted by the AMM.
